It is tempting to get the cheapest art materials but they are the most difficult to use and Jane knows unfortunately from experience. Look out for at least 'Student Quality' written on tubes and labelling. Follow Jane's recommended links below to buy your supplies online from her favourite art supplier 'Jacksons' or pop into their Hove shop. 'Artist Quality' is the best but some colours are more expensive. Follow this simple list and it will help you from day 1

WATERCOLOURS MINIMUM COLOURS - STARTING OUT

- * Cobalt Blue
- * Rose Madder or Permanent Rose
- * Scarlet Lake or Cadmium Red
- * Lemon Yellow

WATERCOLOURS ADDITIONAL COLOURS - BUILDING YOUR PALETTE AS YOU GO

- * Sap Green
- * Viridian Green
- * Turquoise
- * Phthalocyanine Blue

Tubes are easy to use, last for ages and easy to remember as they have the colour name on. Small tubes of 10ml or less are perfect

Pans are portable, great for travelling and carrying, offer great value as you get a range of colours
